Did You Know?

Did vou know replacing an air conditioner's air filter isn't like the Olympics? It shouldn't happen once every four years. In fact, the Department of Energy estimates you can save up to 15% on your energy bills JUST by changing your air filters at least every 90 days. These filters serve an important purpose- they remove dirt, dust and other debris from the air and keep those pollutants from building up in the system. When changed regularly, a clean air filter will reduce vour home's energy consumption and extend the lifespan of the unit.

Hot, dry temperatures are stressful for your lawn. To help keep your grass in pristine condition, raise the height of your lawnmower's blade. Allowing your lawn to grow taller during the summer will help promote a better root system and develop a more drought resistant turf. The taller grass blades also discourage weed development and help shade your soil, which conserves moisture.

Make Your Deck Shine

2011 Election Ballot

Sturnbridge's 2011 Annual Meeting will be held on Saturday, September 24th at the Sturnbridge Park, in conjunction with the neighborhood's Annual Gathering. The only agenda item for this meeting is the elections of board members for the Sturnbridge Homeowners' Association. Voting will be by paper ballot. Each dues paying household in Sturnbridge is allowed one vote. The vote may be cast during the gathering or by sending this completed proxy vote in advance of the meeting to William M. Allen, Jr. at 5605 lvygate Lane or scan and e-mail to president@sturnbridge.com.

You may vote for each individual or for the whole slate listed. Candidates that have agreed to serve appear on this ballot – write in votes are certainly allowed, as we hope to fill all 10 board positions. The newly elected board members will determine individual positions for officers and committee chairpersons as well as length of term at the October 2011 monthly board meeting, per the Sturnbridge Homeowner Association Bylaws.

Each ballot must be completed with the homeowner name, address, and signature to be valid. This is to ensure that only households eligible to vote cast ballots. After verification, the homeowner information will be removed from the vote area prior to tabulation. Remember, it's never too late to pay your Association dues and qualify to vote on neighborhood issues. Feel free to attach your dues check to this ballot (\$125 payable to Sturnbridge Homeowner's Association).
